# MINUTES

#### OF THE

### ALACHUA ASSOCIATION, FLORIDA,

Held with the Church Providence, (Olusta Creek,) Columbia County, Florida, on the 11th, 12th, and 13th days of November, 1848.

1st. The introductory sermon was preached by Elder Daniel Simmons, from the 17th chapter of the Acts of the Apostles, and 30th verse :

"And the times of this ignorance God winked at, but now commandeth all men everywhere to repent.

2d. The Delegates composing the Alachua Association convened at the meeting house, and was called to order by Elder James McDonald. Prayer by Elder Daniel Edwards.

3d. Letters from the churches comprising the Association were then called for, and, thirteen being presented, were read and received, and their statistics minuted.

4th. Petitioners' letters were then called for. None presented. 5th. Proceed to the election of Moderator and Clerk; whereupun Brother McDonald was re-elected Moderator, and Brother Thos. J. Prevatt Clerk. 6th. Appointed Brothers S. Scarborough, J. M. Prevatt, Theop. Weeks, Asa A. Stew-art, and Moses Barber, a committee to arrange the order of Preaching during the Association

7th. Read the Decorum.

8th. Brethren Daniel Edwards, Daniel Simmons, John Tucker, Ryan Frier, and James McDonald, were appointed a committee to arrange the business to come before the Association

9th. Brethren John Jones, Abraham Geiger, Elisha Green, John Curry, and Charles Roach, were appointed a committee on finance

10th. Called for contributions from the churches, which was referred to the committee on finance, who reported letter A.

11th. The committee on Preaching report as follows:

Bro. John Tucker to preach this evening at the house of Daniel Barcos.

Bro, Daniel Edwards at Bro. Theop. Weeks's. Bro. McDonald and Bro. Simmons at Bro. Giles W. Ellis's.

Bro. Frier and Bro. Stanland at Bro. John M. Prevatt's, all by candle-light.

Bro. McDonald at the stand, 11 o'clock A. M.

Bro. Edwards to follow him.

Bro. Frier to follow him.

Bro. Tucker to conclude the services Sunday evening.

12th. Resolved, That there be a collection taken up on Sabbath, immediately after the forenoon services, for an Association fund. 13th. Resolved, That the Ministers and Messengers comprising this Association convene

at the meeting house half past nine o'clock Sabbath morning, and hold a prayer meeting, that the Great Shepherd of his flock would pour out his Spirit upon this part of his vineyard, that a great revival may break out ere the close of this Association. 14th. On motion, adjourned till Monday morning, 10 o'clock A. M.

#### LORD'S DAY, November 12th, 1848.

15th. The ministering Brethren filled the appointments Saturday night, in accordance with previous arrangements, and preached with great force and power to the most respectable and attentive congregations.

16th. The Brethren occupied the stand on Sabbath in the order of their appointments, and preached the words of eternal truth, with great power and energy, to a very large and well-ordered congregation, characterized throughout by the most decent and creditable order and respectful attention, and we do hope and trust that the word preached has and will have its desired effect upon the minds and consciences of the dear waiting audience

17th. On motion, according to the request of New Hope Church, it was agreed to attend to the ordination of Bro. S. T. Stanland.

18th. The ordination of Bro. S. T. Stanland to the Ministry was attended to at 2 o'clock P. M., Sabbath, by a Presbytery of Elders, *i. e.*, McDonald, Tucker, Simmons, and Edwards. Elder John Tucker and Elder Daniel Simmons brought forward Bro. S. T. Stanland for ordination. Elder Edwards gave the introduction of the ordination, by reading from the 3d chapter of the 1st Epistle of Paul, the Apostle, to Timothy, suitable to the occasion. Elder James McDonald gave the ordination charge in a very eloquent and affectionate manner. Ordination prayer by Elder John Tucker. Bible presented by Elder Daniel Simmons. Right hand of fellowship given by the Presbytery

19th. The Preaching committee's appointments for Sunday night: Say—Bro. Frier preach at the Methodist church; Bro. McDonald and Bro. Stanland to preach at Bro. Theop. Weeks's; Bro. Edwards at Bro. Giles U. Ellis's; Bro. Simmons and Tucker at Bro. Elias Osteen's. All by candle-light.

20th. The Preaching Brethren filled the appointments on Sabbath night, in accordance with the instructions of the Preaching committee, to the most attentive and affectionate congregations, and to good effect.

#### MONDAY MORNING, November 13th, 1848

21st. Met, pursuant to adjournment. Prayer by Bro. Moses Barber.

22d. Read and received the minutes of Saturday.

23d. Called for correspondence, when Bro. Ryan Frier and Bro. James J. Polhill, from the Florida Baptist Association, presented themselves, and were received by the Moderator, giving the right hand of fellowship.

· 24th. Called for the circular letter, which was produced, read, and adopted.

25th. Appointed Brethren James McDonald, Moses Barber, Daniel Simmons, Asa A Stewart, and S. Scarborough, correspondents to the Florida Baptist Association, 1849. .26th. Appointed Elder James McDonald to preach the next introductory sermon, and

Bro. D. Edwards alternate. \* 27th. Appointed Elder John Tucker to preach a sennon on Missions, on Sunday

morning, at our next Association. • 28th. Appointed Elder D. Simmons to write the circular letter for our next association, and Bro. T. J. Prevatt in case of failure.

29th. Called for the report of the arranging committee, which was received.

· 30th. On motion, Resolved; That we request the churches of this Association to consider the subject of a Domestic Mission within its bounds, and report to us in their letters next year, what their wish may be with reference to that subject.

- Resolved, That the delegates of this body meet on Friday before our next Association, to consider subjects connected with the welfare of this Association.

· Resolved, That as we are aware that our Clerk, Bro. T. J. Prevatt, is subject to much labor and attention, in having our minutes printed and distributed, we honestly and devoutly think twenty dollars is not too much for his labor and attention.

31st. On motion, agreed to discuss the 4th article of the articles of faith adopted by the Alachua Association.

- 32d. *Resolved*, That the 4th article of our constitution be erased and this be substituted, viz: We believe in the doctrine of Election.

33d. Resolved, That the articles of faith and decorum be republished in our minutes, and that the second part of the preamble thereto annexed be stricken out of the articles. · 34th. Called for the report of the committee on finance, which reported letter B.

35th. Resolved, That the names of the ordained Ministers of this Association, with their several post offices and addresses, be inserted in the Minutes.

36th. Resolved, That we have five hundred copies of the Minutes of this Association printed, for the use of the Association, friends, &c

37th. Resolved, That we hold our next Association with the Church New Providence, (Flemington,) Marion county, Fla., to commence Saturday before the second Sabbath in November, 1849.

38th. Resolved, That we hold four protracted meetings the ensuing year—at South Prong Church, Columbia county, Fla.; at Fort Clark, Alachua county, Fla.; at Fellowship, Marion county, Fla.; at Eden, (Lake Lindsey.) Benton county, Fla.—as follows: At South Prong, commencing on Friday before the first Sabbath in January, 1849; at Fort

Follay before the fifth Sabbath in April, 1849; at Fellowship, Friday before the atts Sublath in July, 1849; at Eden, Friday before the fifth Sabbath in September,

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### CONSTITUTION AND DECORUM

4. This Association shall have noted and at the

We the Churches of Jesus Christ, who have been regularly baptized upon a profession. of our faith, are convinced, from a series of experience, of the necessity of a combination of Churches, and of obtaining a correspondence, for the preserving of a federal union amongst all the Churches of the same faith and order.

1. We believe in one only true and living God, and that there is a trinity of persons the Godhead-the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost; and yet there are not three Gods, but one God.

2. We believe that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments are the Word of God, and the only rule of faith and practice.

3. We believe in the fall of Adam, and the imputation of his sin to his posterity; in the corruption of human nature, and the impotency of man to recover himself by his own free-will ability,

4. We believe in the doctrine of Election. A show be wanted We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God, only by the righteousness of Christ imputed to them.

6. We believe that all those who were chosen in Christ will be effectually called, recenerated, converted, sanctified, and supported by the Spirit and power of God, so that mey shall persevere in grace, and not one of them be finally lost.

We believe that good works are the fruits of faith, and follow after justification, and that they only justify us in the sight of men and angels, and are evidences of our cacous state.

. We believe that there will be a resurrection of the dead, and a general judgment the happiness of the righteous and the punishment of the wicked will be eternal.

#### And as for Gospel order:

1. We believe that the visible Church of Christ is a congregation of faithful persons, and the second s the Lool and to one another, and have agreed to keep up a Godly discipline, agreeable the rules of the Gospel.

a We believe that true believers in Jesus Christ are the only subjects of Baptism, and mersion is the mode

5. We believe that none but regularly baptized Church members have a right to communion at the Lord's table.

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6. We believe that it is the duty of every heaven-born soul to become a member of the visible Church, to make a public profession of his faith, to be legally baptized, so as to have a right to, and to partake of the Lord's Supper, at every legal opportunity through the whole course of his life.

7. We believe that no minister has a right to the administration of the ordinance of Baptism and the Lord's Supper, only such as are regularly called and come under the imposition of the hands of the Presbytery.

Having laid down a summary of the faith and order upon which we intend to associate, we therefore propose to mention, for the Decorum of our Association, the following plan or form of government:

ARTICLE 1. Those members who are regularly chosen by the Churches in our Union shall compose the Association.

2. The members so chosen shall produce letters from their respective churches, certify their appointments, together with their number in fellowship, those baptized, received by letter, restored, dismissed, excommunicated, and dead, since our last Association. 3. The members thus chosen and convened shall be denominated the Alachua Asso-

ciation

4. This Association shall have no power to Lord it over God's heritage, nor by which they can infringe upon any of the internal rights of the churches.

5. The Association shall have a Moderator and Clerk, who shall be chosen by the members present.

6. If new churches desire to be admitted into this union, they shall petition by letters and messengers, and upon examination, if found orthodox and orderly, shall be received by the Association, and it shall be manifested by the Moderator giving the messengers the right hand of fellowship. 7. No church in the union shall have a right to more than two messengers, till she

shall exceed one hundred members, and then she shall have a right to an additional messenger, for every fifty after the first hundred.

8. Every query sent to the Association, by any church in the union, shall be read and put to vote by the Moderator, whether it shall be debated; and if there be a majority for, it shall be taken up and investigated; but if not, it shall be withdrawn: Provided always, that those be first considered which affect the union of churches.

9. Every motion made and seconded shall come under the observation of the Association, except it be withdrawn by the member who made it.

10. Every member who speaks in debate shall rise from his seat and address the Moderator, and shall not be interrupted while speaking, except he depart from the subject.

11. No person shall speak more than three times to the same query, without leave of the Association.

12. There shall be no talking or whispering in the time of a public speech, nor reflections cast upon the speaker.

13. No member shall absent himself from the Association, without leave of the Moderator

14. If any member shall break the rules of this Decorum, he shall be immediately reproved by the Moderator.

15. It is the business of this Association, first, to provide for the general union of the churches; second, to keep up a correspondence with those Associations of the same faith and order, that a chain of communication may be preserved amongst the churches ; thirdly, to give the churches the best advice they can in matters of difficulty; and, if the communion should be broken between any of the sister churches in the union, to enquire into the cause of the breach, and use their best endeavors to remove the difficulty; but if the breach cannot be healed, to withdraw from any church or churches whom they shall look upon to be unsound in principle, or immoral in practice, till they be reclaimed; fourthly, to admit any of the brethren in the ministry as assistants, if they shall judge it to be necessary; fifthly, to appoint a Secretary, to keep a book, and regularly to record the proceedings of every Association, and to see that he is satisfied for his trouble; sixthly, to have the minutes of the Association read and corrected, if need be, and signed by the Moderator and clerk, before the Association rises, and have them printed, if they think proper; seventh, to amend this form or plan of government at any time when the majority of the union shall deem it to be necessary; eighth, to adjourn to any time or place they may think to be most proper.
