

# MINUTES.

The Santa Fe River Association met today, October 24, 1900, with Mounteocha Church, at Mounteocha, Fla., eight miles west of Waldo, Fla.

The Introductory Sermon was preached by the appointee, Rev. N. T. King, from James 2:26, after which the Association adjourned until 1:30 p. m.

#### Afternoon Session.

The Association was called to order. Song, "Is my name written there?" Prayer by A. J. York.

Letters from churches called for and the Moderator appointed Robert McClellan and George Vanlandingham to read them.

It was moved and seconded that a committee be appointed to bring in a report in reference to advising the Orange Heights Church about buying the M. E. church house of that place. #### Report on Spiritual Condition of Churches.

We are glad to report that we find an increase of 103, as compared with an increase of 48 last year. But we should not be satisfied even with this increase when there are so many perishing souls about us.

We are alarmed to find some of our churches without prayer meetings and Sunday Schools. This should not be the case. How can we extend the work unless the Word of God is taught? We prayerfully recommend that each church look well to having a Sunday School and prayer meeting.

#### Report on Woman's Work.

We recommend the American Baptist Publication Society and Southern Baptist Convention periodicals for our Sunday Schools. We believe them sound in doctrine. We urge that they have a liberal patronage; also our home paper, published at Ocala, the Florida Baptist Witness; and Our Home Field and Foreign Mission Journal, to educate our people in the great work of home and foreign missions. Last, but not least, the Holy Bible, the Book of books, should be our daily study and companion.

#### WOMAN'S MISSIONARY UNION.

The annual meeting of the Woman's Missionary Union of the Santa Fe River Association was held on the evening of the second day of the Association. The devotional exercises consisted of the reading of selections of Scripture giving the voice of the New Testament on missions. Prayer by Miss Mary A. Taylor, of Tampa.

Mrs. Eva Bennett gave the song of welcome and was responded to by Mrs. F. J. Fowler.

The roll call was responded to by six W. M. U. and two Sunbeam Bands.

Mesengers from several churches having no societies expressed a hope of organization in the near future.

Letters were read from the Home and Foreign Boards, after which a collection was taken for missions.

Committees were appointed to solicit subscriptions for the Home Field, Foreign Mission Journal and Florida Baptist Witness.

Mrs. Merryman, the Associational Vice President, reported two W. M. U. and two Sunbeam Bands organized since her appointment in April last. She reported eleven visits and seventyty-five letters and thirteen postal cards written.

Urgent requests have been made from several churches for the organization of societies.

Three public meetings have been held in connection with the Sunday School Convention of our Association.

Mrs. Rosa E. Merryman, of Melrose, and Mrs. Susie Jackson, of Gainesville, were elected Vice Presidents of the Woman's Missionary Union of Florida for the Santa Fe River Association.

A most excellent talk was given by Miss Mary A. Taylor on "Shining for Christ," followed by a song, "Let the Lower Lights Be Burning," after which Miss Taylor dismissed the Union with prayer.

#### CONSTITUTION.

- This Association shall be called the Santa Fe River Baptist Association.
- 2. This Association shall be composed of messengers from Baptist churches, of which they must be members, maintaining the Gospel discipline, and they must present letters from their respective churches certifying to their election as messengers.

- The object of this Association shall be the reunion of the churches, the promotion of the true Gospel, and the dissemination of Bible truth.
- This Association shall meet annually, on the first day of which meeting it shall elect, by ballot, a Moderator, a Clerk and a Treasurer.
- 5. Any Baptist church newly organized may become a member of this Association by a letter petitioning for membership and giving information concerning organization and presbytery and by whom organized. Any church coming from another Association may become a member of this Association by presenting petitionary letter, accompanied by a letter of dismission from the Association from which it comes.
- 6. This Association admits the right of any one of the churches comprising it to withdraw by application for a letter without assigning any reason for so doing. At the same time, this Association claims the right to withdraw from any church which departs from the principles of this compact by becoming heterodox in faith or disorderly in practice.
- 7. This Association shall be deemed an advisory council and shall treat the churches composing it as independent bodies in all matters of self-government, and shall at no time interfere with their rights.
- 8. This Association shall have an Executive Committee of five, of which the Treasurer shall be a member ex-officio. The other four members shall be elected annually by the Association, no two members being from the same church. Three shall constitute a quorum for business. The Executive Committee shall elect its own chairman and secretary and shall have power to fill vacancies.
- 9. The Associational mission work shall be under the control and supervision of the Executive Committee, and all missionaries shall make quarterly reports to them when called upon to do so.
- 10. All churches shall be entitled to two messengers for the first fifty members and one additional messenger for each twenty-five members after the first fifty and for the major fraction thereof.
- 11. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive and disburse all funds of the Association, but only by order of the Association or Executive Committee.
- This Constitution may be amended at any regular meeting of the Association by a two-thirds vote of the messengers present.
