MINUTES.

According to previous appointment the Association met with the Live Oak Baptist church, Orange county, Florida, October 1st, 1880. Elder R. W. Lawton preached the introductory sermon from 1st Timothy, 3d chapter, 16th verse: "And without controversy great is the mystery of godliness. God was manifest in the flesh, justified in the spirit, seen of angels, preached unto the Gentiles, believed on in the world, received up into glory." Elder S. F. Gove offered prayer and pronounced the benediction.

After refreshments the delegates assembled at the house. Prayer by Elder W. J. Hughes of the Alachua Association. After which Elder J. H. Hayman, former Moderator, called the body to order, and W. B. Culpepper took his place as Clerk.

Letters from the churches were called for, and received letters from eight churches, which were read and the names of the delegates enrolled as shown by the statistical table. On motion of Elder R. W. Lawton the rule of electing by ballot was suspended, and Elder George C. Powell as Moderator, and W. B. Culpepper, Clerk, were elected by acclamation. Visiting brethren of the same faith and order were invited to seats with the body, which was accepted by Elders W. J. Hughes and S. T. Standland, Brethren J. E. E. Border and D. A Fryer of the Alachua Association. Petitionary letters were then called for, when letters were presented from Moss Bluff and New Salem churches, asking for admission, which was granted. The right hand of fellowship was given by the Moderator, and delegates admitted to seats. Committees were then appointed as follows:

SATURDAY MORNING.

The Association met according to adjournment. Prayer by Elder W. N. Chaudoin. Invitation to visiting brethren continued. Received Elder W. N. Chaudoin, Missionary for Home Missions and corresponding editor of the INDEX. On motion of Elder L. J. Simmons, Elder S. F. Gove was released from preaching the missionary sermonat 11 o'clock A. M. on Sunday, and Elder W. N. Chaudoin was requested to occupy the stand. On motion, Elder W. N. Chaudoin was allowed an hour to speak for the Christian Index.

At 11 o'clock A.M. Elder W. J. Hughes occupied the stand, and preached a very feeling sermon from 8th Psalm, 4th verse: "What is man that thou art mindful of him, and the son of man that thou visitest him."

At 2 P.M. business was resumed.

On motion of Elder S. F. Gove: That the Moderator appoint an Executive Committee of seven, who are, in addition to other duties, charged to devise and put in force a missionary system. And the following brethren were appointed: Elder S. F. Gove, J. R. A. Tucker, W. B. Culpepper, Elder R. W. Lawton, I. D. Dorsett, J. W. Blitch, J. M. Owens.

ARTICLES OF FAITH.

prayed. Rom. 3: 12: Gen. 1: 21-28, 3: 6-8.

4. We believe that man is utterly unable, by his own free will and ability, to recover himself from the faller state in which he is by nature. Heb. 9: 22, 23; 1 Peter 2 84, and 3: 18.

5. We believe in the doctrine of election, and that God chose His people in Christ before the world began. Eph

1: 35; Titus 1: 1, 2.

6. We believe in the covenant of redemption and salvation by grace, entered into by the Sacred Three, in behalf of the elect on whom Grace and Glory were settled forever in Christ, their covenant head. Psalms 89: 2-4, and 27: 37; Eph. 1: 35; 2 Tim. 1: 9.

7. We believe that sinners are justified in the sight of God by the imputed righteousness of Christ only, and that they receive pardon and reconciliation through Him. Rom

8. We believe that God's elect shall be called, regener ated and sanctified by the influence and operation of the Holy Spirit. 1 Peter 1: 2; Mal. 3: 17.

9. We believe that saints shall be preserved in Grace, and that none of them shall be lost. John 10: 22-29; Rom. 8.

31-39; 2 Tim. 1: 9.

10. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, and the general judgment; and that the joy of the righteous and the punishment of the wicked will be eternal. Job 19:
