CONSTITUTION of the NEW RIVER BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE I - NAME

This Association shall be known as the New River Missionary Baptist Association and shall be composed of accredited messengers who are members of constituted churches. An accredited messenger shall be one who has been duly elected by his church as a messenger or alternate. All pastors of the churches in the Association shall be enrolled as messengers but only those holding membership in constituted churches of the Association shall be eligible for office.

ARTICLE II - MESSENGERS

Each church in this Association shall be entitled to three messengers and one additional messenger for every twenty-five members in excess of fifty members. All Churches are expected to send with their messengers letters to the Association containing account of their state on regular form used by the State Convention and the Association with all questions answered and remarks where necessary. These letters should be forwarded to the Clerk two weeks in advance of the annual meeting when possible. The churches proportionate amount to the Association Budget should accompany the Annual Letter whenever possible. The Associational Year shall be from October 1st to September 30th.

ARTICLE III - CHURCHES

SECTION 1. Baptist churches desiring admission into this body shall notify the Executive Committee at least one month prior to the Annual Meeting of the Association and shall petition by letter and messengers to the Association. On giving satisfactory evidence of their being sound in faith and the Gospel, and correct in practice, and in harmony with the work of the Association, may be received by a vote of the Association at the annual meeting and the Moderator be authorized to extend the right hand of fellowship in behalf of the Association.

SECTION 2. The Association acknowledges the independence of the individual churches and that no authority or jurisdiction is to be exercised over them by this Association and therefore disclaims all power of making lawsfor them under any pretext whatsoever, but deems it its duty to exclude any church that may be considered unworthy of fellowship. No church shall be excluded however without a thorough investigation by the executive

Committee and vote of the Association at the Annual Meeting.

SECTION 3. When a church shall neglect to make a communication to the Association for at least two years, it shall be considered as having withdrawn and shall be dropped by vote from the minutes unless the Executive Committee recommends its continuance for one year. Any church wishing to sever its connection with this body may be allowed to do so upon an application duly made to the Association while in session, and a letter granted thereon.

ARTICLE IV - REGULATIONS

The Association shall hold its sessions annually at such time and place as the Association may elect and while in session will be governed by Roberts Rules of Order. The Executive Committee, however shall be authorized to make such changes in either time or place of meeting as may be found to be expedient.

ARTICLE V - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

SECTION 1. The Officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Vice Moderator and Clerk-Treasurer, each of whom shall be chosen by separate ballot. These officers shall be elected at the opening session of the Annual Meeting and take office at the close of the meeting. The Moderator and Vice Moderator cannot serve more than two years in succession.

SECTION 2. Duties of the Officers: (a) The Moderator shall preside over all meetings of the Association throughout the year. He shall also act as Chairman of the Executive Committee. During the year he shall seek to promote the harmony of the individual churches and moderate with unbiased leadership whenever invited. In general his duties will be those of any President of an Assembly. Prior to the Association meeting he shall appoint the Committee on Committees, the Budget Committee and any other committee on authority of the Executive Committee that shall expedite the work of the Association.

(b) The Vice Moderator's duties will be those ascribed to him by the Moderator and to serve in the capacity of the Moderator during his absence from any meeting or at any time requested. If during the term of service the Moderator should move from the Association or his service to the Association be lost, the Vice-Moderator shall assume the place of the Moderator.

(c) The Clerk-Treasurer shall keep an accurate record of the proceedings of all Association meetings including a separate record of the Executive Committee. It shall be his duty to prepare and distribute the minutes of the Annual Meeting, to keep a file of the minutes yearly and to co-operate both with the State Convention and the Moderator and churches. He shall also receive all funds from the churches and from any meetings, or any other source, and disburse same according to the budget, and or, by direction of the Executive Committee. He shall also keep a record on all funds received and disbursed and report to the Executive Committee at each meeting and to the Annual Meeting of the Association. A complete record of his term of office and all previous records received by him shall be turned over to his successor in office at the close of the Annual Meeting.

ARTICLE VI - DUTIES OF COMMITTEES

Section 1. (a) The Committee on Committees shall appoint a Nominations Committee, a Time, Place and Preacher Committee and a Resolutions Committee and these to report at the Annual Association Meeting.

(b) The Nominations Committee shall nominate the Sunday School Superintendent; the Training Union Director; President of Woman's Missionary Union; President of Brotherhood; Director of Music; Superintendent of Evangelism at the June Executive Committee meeting. (c) The Time, Place and Preacher Committee shall nominate the time and place for next Annual Meeting and the Preachers to bring the Annual Sermons and their alternates.

(d) The Resolutions Committee shall receive all resolutions to be brought to the Annual Meeting and shall bring as a recommendation any resolutions to be acted on at the meeting and all other resolutions shall be brought for consideration. (e) The Program Committee shall be composed of the Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer, Pastor of the host churches and any others advisable to assist in preparing the program. (f) The Budget Committee shall prepare the budget of the Association including all expenditures of all departments of the work and recommended apportionment to each church and submit same to the Association at its Annual Meeting for approval.

Section 2. The Executive Committee: The Executive Committee of the Association shall be composed of: (a) The officers of the Association, (b) All Pastors of churches members of the Association, and (c) Heads of all departments elected by the Association, and (d) one layman elected by each church in the Association. The Duties of the Executive Committee shall be those ascribed by the Association and it shall conduct all business of the Association between Annual Meetings. The Committee shall organize itself into special committees at any time it is necessary to expedite the work of the Association and is authorized to fill all vacancies which may occur during the Associational year. The Committee shall meet monthly and a quorum for business shall be 14 members.

ARTICLE VII - AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be amended at any annual meeting by a two-thirds vote provided that notice of such change shall have been given to the Executive Committee not later than the last Executive Committee meeting previous to the Association meeting and that notice of such change be given to the Association on the first day of such meeting.

BY-LAWS

I. An Association Missions Committee to be composed of 5 members with one member elected each year to serve a 5 year period or until removal from the Association membership or residency or dismissal for nonattendance at 3 meetings during a year. When a vacancy occurs it shall be filled at the annual meeting for the length of the unexpired term. The members of this committee shall be nominated by the Nominating Committee and elected by the Association.

The duties of the committee shall be to work in cooperation with other Missions Committees of the District and to report to the Annual Associational meeting and Executive Committee during the year.

In Scripture much stress is laid upon faithfulness - faithfulness in work, worship, witness - faithfulness in personal devotion and, particularly, faithfulness in the stewardship of the manifold goodness of God.

It is scarcely a debatable matter when one affirms that the only true freedom man ever enjoys touches vitally the freedom of mind to think, the freedom of heart to espouse and the freedom of love to nurture and support. All of these are inherent in the purposes of Christ and His gospel and are a part of the Christian witness.

The business of any Agency such as the Florida Baptist Foundation is to constantly emphasize these truths and seek to strengthen and support the forces leading to an ever wider acceptance thereof.

The Foundation is therfore, primarily an Agency seeking to strengthen all the causes of our faith all around the world, by encouraging our people to commit their substance to these causes by the Scriptural tithe during lifetime and by Will or Bequest or Trust to serve when the earthly stewardship has passed.

Since the above is true it is only a matter of elementary prudence for a faithful steward to "plan" his estate well. Some people, after they have worked hard and conserved diligently to accumulate property, give far too little thought to plans for protecting and disposing of their property after death. Such failure is often due to one or a combination of circumstances; namely, misunderstanding, lack of knowledge or pressure from a multitude of daily details or merely a disposition to "put it off". That may easily become fatal to the best use of the fruits of a life's activities.

In the planning of an Estate the importance of an experienced Attorney cannot be over estimated. By its very nature the creation of an Estate Plan involves many important legal questions requiring the knowledge of competent Counsel. The effectiveness of a Trust Agreement may depend largely upon the provisions that are made. And in the field of taxation the knowledge of experienced Councel is of utmost importance that these accumulations of a lifetime of labor may accomplish their greatest good.

During the year 11 Wills have been advised upon and while their value to the Convention Agencies may not be listed, they have been considerable. Information concerning 4 other Wills have come to us from several law offices in the State. One Gift Annuity has been applied for and details are being arranged for a second such Contract. The gift portions of these Annuities go to State Convention Agencies.

The Foundation continues to handle endowment for Baptist Bible Institute, Florida Normal and Industrial Memorial College and Stetson University and commends these interest to the generosity of our people.

4:40 - Report - Baptist Bible Institute - J.C. Fleming

The current Southern Baptist Convention policy on limiting enrolment of non-college graduates in our seminaries has created dangers. God-called men need a loyal, dedicated atmosphere where they can prepare for their ministry.

Baptist Bible Institute at Graceville, Florida, provided by the Florida Baptist State Convention, meets this need. Properly recommended applicants may enroll, without even so much as a high school diploma.

Curriculum - To graduate, a student must complete a three-year course (100 semester hours) that parallels work done on the Bachelor

of Divinity degree, but without languages.

Enrollment - Enrollment is highest in the school's history. Total enrollment last year (1960-61) was 189. September 1961 was 200, with more expected in the spring semester and the summer school that follows. The enrollment figure will reach at least 225, perhaps more, for this year.

Faculty - The faculty ranks with that of any Southern Baptist seminary or college in earned degrees. A new man coming into the theological or religious education faculty must have his earned doctorate, or be working toward it.

Finances - The Cooperative Program provided \$72,627 through the Florida Baptist State Convention budget.

The Institute budget is set at \$155,055.00 for 1961-62, an increase with rising cost and an increased student body in mind. This means that more churches should put the school in their local budgets (this is officially agreed upon in the State Convention). We must raise \$20,000 in this way. Endowment, now quite small, must be substantially increased.

Current and Future Needs - More students mean more problems. We have too few apartments, and too few classrooms. We could fill a woman's building, if we had one, and also fill 25 new apartments. We need a music building and an educational building now.

The Institute will soon launch a building fund and endowment campaign. The purpose is to raise \$100,000 for building a new administration building, and \$100,000 for endowment. It is hoped the people of Florida will give this whole-hearted support.

Place In World Missions - Our successes, the growing student body, an effective teaching program, and the work of our graduates and alumni, have brought favorable attention from Southern Baptist leaders, and students came this year from 16 states and Canada. The Southern Baptist Convention Program Committee recently considered the matter of Bible schools for the Convention, and were favorably impressed.

More colleges are accepting our credits now, than in previous years, which gives evidence of the growing respect for our work. We face an ever brighter future.

Pray For Us. Put us in your budgets. Use us when you can. We -- the entire Institute family - - - feel ourselves to be fellow-workers with God and with you.

Rev. Stedham reported on the Campsite on Black Creek. A motion was made that we express our appreciation to Mr. & Mrs. Samuel Saunders for offering the 10 acre camp-site on Black Creek, but since the site is not suitable for our purposes that we regretfully reject their kind offer. Seconded and carried.

The Association agreed that we are still interested in a camp-site if and when a suitable one is available.

5:30 - Report - Baptist Children's Home - T.M. Johns.

The Children's Home is increasing its casework and counseling services. Two caseworkers have been added in recent months, bringing the number in this area of service to four. The Caseworkers investigate the applications for admission to the Home, discuss the family problems with parents and children and make recommendations as to the type of help the child needs. It is also their duty to counsel with the housestaff and the child that he may get the greatest possible assistance from his stay in the Home. They work with parents and children around his return to his community and home and offer help after the child leaves the institution if it should be needed by the family. A few years ago the Children's Home began placing families of children in the same cottage. They share the same living room, dining room, playground, study hall and in many ways live as they would were they at home. The purpose of the change is to rear brothers and sisters of the same family together that they might learn to depend on, and to help, each other, The program is working out fine. It is hoped that by doing this, family solidarity will be established and the children will have more security by helping each other.

The Home received 430 applications for admission from July 1, 1960 to June 30, 1961. Seventy eight were accepted in the Home at Lakeland and Miami. Those who needed assistance that could not be provided by the Florida Baptist Children's Home were referred to other agencies. The total number cared for during the year was 224.

There is a need for more financial assistance from our churches, especially those who do not have the Home in their budget. Individuals, classes, W.M.U. and others may help too. They can assist by providing clothing, giving a small amount of spending money, providing school lunches, and sending presents to some child on his birthday and at Christmas.

The Thanksgiving offering should not be ignored by those who do not have the Home in the budget of their church. This matter should be called to the attention of the congregation, that those who wish to give may do so. It takes only a few cents from every church member each month to meet the needs of our children. If every church would would give five cents per month for each member enrolled, it would be sufficient for all operating expenses of our Children's Home.

The Relief and Annuity Board no longer exists - name-wise that is. The official name is now Annuity Board of the Southern Baptist Convention. Deletion of the words "Relief And" from the title was approved at the 1960 Southern Baptist Convention in Miami, and made official in March of this year, when trustees of the Board voted to change the Board's charter, incorporating the new name. Baptist over the Convention are urged to use the Board's new name.

Benefits amounting to \$2,745,613.60 were paid to more than 5,200 retired and disabled ministers and denominational workers or widows during 1960. A little more than 4,200 of these were beneficiaries of one of the Board's retirement plans, and the rest were on the relief rolls. Four hundred forty six were new annuitants, added in 1960. Since the Board's beginning in 1918, it has paid out benefits totaling, \$34,425,100.55.

Total new members in all the Annuity Board's plans in 1960 increased by nine per cent over 1959, with the largest increase, 2,053. being in the Southern Baptist Protection Plan. Total membership stood at 22,578 on January 1, 1961. More than 4,000 of the churches participating in the protection program are paying the full 10 per cent dues. This is an increase of 17 per cent over the previous year.

Fifteen field representatives now serve 22 states in the Convention. The continued increase in new members in the Board's protection program in recent years can definitely be attributed to the work of education and promotion being carried out by these men within the local churches and associations.

The Associational Planning Committee met 3 times. The Regular Meetings were held at New River with 30 men representing 9 churches; Starke First with 24 men representing 7 churches; Beulah with 29 men representing 10 churches.

The interest in the State Prison Brotherhood, W.H. Williams, Leader, has grown. We now have 153 men with 6 men accepting the Lord. The literature has been contributed by Starke First Church, Northside, Church, and G.W. Schroeder, Executive Secretary of the Brotherhood

The Brotherhood participated in the campaign against the sale of liquor in Bradford County.

We hope to - (1) - Train Brotherhood workers, - (2) - Promote Associational Library, - (3) - Establish more Brotherhoods.

At present we have 7 Brotherhood Organizations reported this year with an enrollment of 128 men and 8 Royal Ambassador Chapters with 84 boys.

Several churches were represented at the Brotherhood Encampment at Deland and at the Royal Ambassador Congress in Jacksonville. This report was adopted.

The Cooperative Program represents all the work that Southern

Baptist are cooperatively undertaking for Christ. It is our conviction that the whole of our Cooperative Program is more important than any one, or any combination of its parts. No single cause stands alone.

Each is dependent on the others.

We believe that the whole of our Cooperative Program will have greater appeal to the Baptist of New River association than any one of its parts when it is clearly understood. Since information is the only intelligent basis for cooperation, we recommend that the leaders of our association make every effort to explain the Cooperative Program to the people during the coming year, and give this program loyal and prayerful support.

The Forward Program of Church Finance is now in its fifth year of use and is rendering service to churches in planning, promoting, and

pledging annual budgets.

Recognizing that some churches need help in budget planning and pledging before attempting the entire Forward Program, stages have been provided for churches with little previous experience in this area.

Known as the Beginner and Intermediate Stages, these helps are now available in the 1961 Guidebook.

RECOMMENDATIONS '

We recommend:

1. That every church in New River association include the Cooperative Program in its budget on a percentage basis.

2. That churches consider the 2 Plus plan. This plan means increasing by at least two the percentage of the total budget going to missions through the Cooperative Program each year.
